

500 FOR 500: 500 WAYS TO RAISE \$ £ € R 500

This project will be completely different for every person and there will be many ideas in here that do not relate to you and your life at all! Just have a read, find an idea or two that will work for you, and give it a go!

CHANGE EXCHANGE

Donate the money you save... a CHANGE EXCHANGE!

1. Make 3-4 coffees a week at home instead of buying them = \$ £ € R 500
2. Donate 1-2 hours of your salary for 52 weeks* (**or less!**) Minimum wage: \$15.51; £6.08; €10.00; R15.79 - *52 = \$ £ € R 500
3. Save all your \$ £ € R 2 coins for a year
4. FAMINE CHALLENGE – 4 weeks a year only use what you have in the pantry and freezer plus \$ £ € R 30 for fresh food and then donate what you would have normally used on groceries for the week. \$ £ € R 150-\$ £ € R 30 = \$ £ € R 120*4=\$ £ € R 480
5. FAMINE CHALLENGE once a month you only have to save \$ £ € R 41 on a grocery shop – use what you have in your fridge/freezer/pantry instead of buying all new for the week.
6. Each week put all of your change from your pockets/purse/around the house into a change tin – they fill up really quickly and you might not even notice it!
7. Casual workers – ask for an extra hour a week and donate that hour's pay.
8. Budget to save an extra \$ £ € R 10 a week
9. Borrow books from the library or friends instead of buying them for a year.
10. De-clutter your house – sell all of your old books that you won't read again to a 2nd hand bookshop
11. EBay some of your clothes/household goods that you don't need anymore
12. Make homemade cards for family and friends and save what you would have spent on cards.
13. Learn to sew and do your own alterations!
14. Make gifts for your friends and family and donate the savings – homemade gifts are always more personal – if you have kids this is even better – they can make them! ☺
15. Have a big event coming up, need a new dress? Borrow or re-use. Use the money you would usually spend to donate.
16. Every new piece of clothing, shoes that you buy donate 50% of paid price to project
17. Sacrifice three luxury items from your weekly household shop and donate the money you save. Encourage friends and colleagues to join in with you!
18. If you buy something on sale – donate the amount that you saved on the RRP
19. Buy in bulk at the big discount stores
20. Shop the specials at the grocery store and try some new brands instead of buying your usual!

21. When making a major purchase, shop around and find the best deal
22. Borrow clothes from friends for your kids instead of buying all new each season. Donate the savings
23. Car Pool with colleagues to work and donate the petrol and toll savings
24. Buy your Christmas presents for kids in the July toy sales and donate the money you save.
25. Pick up that big item instead of paying the delivery fee
26. Stretch your hair appointments to once every 8 weeks for a year.
27. Do a home dye job twice a year or ask a friend to help you! ☺
28. No pedicure-paint your own toenails for a whole year!
29. Do your own waxing - be careful!!!

69. Borrow a movie from a friend and have a movie night at home instead of going to the movies – don't forget to make popcorn as well!
70. Buy prescription glasses online instead of the stores
71. Limit borrowing DVD's to the cheapest day of the week only!
72. Match what you would spend for weekly entertainment for the project!
73. Buy prescription glasses online instead of the stores
74. “Girl's night in” event. Be creative-invite a stylist, beauty therapist-whatever your heart desires! Donate what you would have spent on going out!

81. HOW TO RAISE \$ £ € R 500 in ONE WEEK
 - DAY 1: Start by making your own donation for \$ £ € R 25. Set up your personal profile page on the website and email your friends to sponsor you.
 - DAY 2: Ask three family members to sponsor you for \$ £ € R 25 each.
 - DAY 3: Ask two businesses you visit frequently to donate \$ £ € R 25 each.
 - DAY 4: Ask five co-workers to sponsor you for \$£ € R 20 each.
 - DAY 5: Ask your boss for a company contribution of \$ £ € R 100. Check to see if your company runs a scheme to match what you raise – dollar matching is a great way to double your money.
 - DAY 6: Ask five people you know from your local club, pub, school or church to donate \$10each.
 - DAY 7: Ask five friends to donate \$ £ € R 20 each.
 There's your \$ £ € R 500! Woo-hoo!
82. Let friends and family know on social media that you are fundraising and give them an opportunity to contribute!

145. Host a catwalk night where all new season styles are paraded! Ask local boutiques for samples of new clothes. This is a great night to sell home-made goodies too!
146. Have a creative cooking night! Eg: All food must be pink, or have strawberries etc.
147. Pamper party- Host an evening of indulgence for you and your friends. Slap on the facemasks, get the nails painted and enjoy a foot spa. Oh, and don't forget the chocolate!
148. Grow and sell your own local produce at local markets

150. Host a 'Gone with the wind night' Screen the movie and have popcorn and snacks to host it just like the movies!

159. 'BYO Pool Party' - participants are to pay an entry fee and are to byo blow up (children's) wading pool (they are cheap at kmart, big w etc)... Floaties will suffice if a wading pool is too much. Upon arrival - participants are to blow up their pool and fill with water - and seat themselves in their pool for the event. You will need a good MC or 2 for this event and some space. You could have a live band, and activities for kids (face painting etc) but most activities are designed to be done in your pool. You could sell hot dogs (sausage sizzle) and drinks. Pools could be given to the local salvation army? store after the event.
160. 'Mocktail Party' - charge an entry fee and/ or provide mocktails (for a fee). Depending on the age demographic of your guests - choose eg. 80's Singstar. Singstar is like Karaoke but it scores you on your vocal accuracy... Great fun for those willing to have a go.
161. 'Coffee on the Porch' - this is real simple. Invite friends and neighbours (who haven't met yet) for 'coffee on the porch' of your choosing - yours or a friends... And let them know that its for a good cause - there will be a cover charge, some new faces, and some chill out time. You could provide morning/afternoon tea... And build awareness (as people will chat about it) and some finance for your cause.

You'll charge a flat fee per item. Supporters will also not be able to see what they're buying. Have volunteers donate inexpensive items. They can be anything from used books to gag items. You can also spend a little money to buy fun things at a dollar store. Place each item in a paper bag and seal all the bags so the items inside are not visible. No feeling or shaking of bags is allowed!
240. Bring a dollar to work day-depending on the amount of people in your corporation you can increase if needed
241. You can make your workplace fun with all these crazy, yet effective ideas!
242. Lunch with the boss day. Employees who are interested pay to enter and one employee gets drawn out. IF your boss agrees have him to the cover the lunch!
